

KETTLE

Read the instructions, keep them safe, pass them on if you pass the appliance on. Remove all packaging before use.

IMPORTANT SAFEGUARDS

Follow basic safety precautions, including:

This appliance can be used by children aged from 8 years and above and persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities or lack of experience and knowledge if they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance in a safe way and understand the hazards involved. Children shall not play with the appliance. Cleaning and user maintenance shall not be made by children unless they are older than 8 and supervised. Keep the appliance and its cord out of reach of children aged less than 8 years.

Keep the appliance and cable out of reach of children under 8 years.

▲ The surfaces of the appliance will get hot.

If you overfill, the kettle may spit boiling water.

Use the kettle only with the stand supplied (and vice versa).

If the cable is damaged, return the appliance, to avoid hazard.

- Don't put the kettle, stand, cable, or plug in liquid.
- Keep the kettle, stand, and cable away from the edges of worktops.
- Don't use the kettle for any purpose other than heating water.
- Don't operate the appliance if it's damaged or malfunctions.

HOUSEHOLD USE ONLY BEFORE USING FOR THE FIRST TIME

Fill to max, boil, discard the water, then rinse. Do this twice to remove any manufacturing dust, etc.

FILLING

- 1. Remove the lid.
- 2. Fill with at least 1 cup of water, but not above max.
- 3. If you want only 1, 2, or 3 cups of water, fill to the 1, 2, or 3 marks inside the kettle.
- 4. Refit the lid. Always fit the lid when boiling the kettle.

USING YOUR KETTLE

- 1. Put the stand on a stable, level surface.
- 2. Plug the stand into the wall socket.
- 3. Put the kettle on the stand.
- 4. Move the switch to I.
- 5. The kettle will start to heat.
- 6. When the water boils the kettle will switch off.
- 7. To switch off manually, move the switch to **O**, or simply lift the kettle off the stand.

GENERAL

When you lift the kettle, you may see moisture on the stand. Don't worry – it's the steam used to switch off automatically, which then condenses and escapes via vents under the kettle.

BOIL DRY PROTECTION

- 1. This will shorten the life of the element. A boil-dry cut-out will switch the kettle off.
- 2. You must then remove the kettle from its stand to reset the cut-out.
- 3. Sit the kettle on the work surface till it's cold.


CARE AND MAINTENANCE

- 1. Unplug the stand, and let the kettle cool before cleaning.
- 2. Wipe all surfaces with a clean damp cloth.
- 3. Keep the connectors dry.
- 4. Remove the lid.
- 5. Push the hook on top of the filter down, then lift the filter out of the kettle.
- 6. Rinse the filter under a running tap while brushing with a soft brush.
- 7. From inside the kettle, fit the bottom hook on the filter in the bottom of the spout.
- 8. Press the top of the filter towards the spout, to lock the upper hook in place.
- 9. Refit the lid.

Descale regularly, (at least monthly).

- Descale the appliance at least monthly with a proprietary descaler. Follow the instructions on the package of descaler.
- Products returned under guarantee with faults due to scale will be subject to a repair charge.





TOASTER

Read the instructions, keep them safe, pass them on if you pass the appliance on. Remove all packaging before use.

IMPORTANT SAFEGUARDS

Follow basic safety precautions, including:

This appliance can be used by children aged from 8 years and above and persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities or lack of experience and knowledge if they have been supervised/instructed and understand the hazards involved.

Children shall not play with the appliance.

Cleaning and user maintenance shall not be done by children unless they are older than 8 and supervised.

Keep the appliance and cable out of reach of children under 8.

Don't connect the appliance via a timer or remote control system.

Bread may burn. Don't use the appliance near or below combustible materials (e.g. curtains).

▲ The surfaces of the appliance will get hot.

Remove and empty the crumb tray. Wipe with a damp cloth, dry, then replace in the toaster.

If the cable is damaged, return the appliance, to avoid hazard.

 $\textcircled{\sc opt}$ Do not use this appliance near bathtubs, showers, basins or other vessels containing water.

- When using a single toasting slot, check that the other slot is empty.
- Don't toast "buttered", torn, or misshapen bread.
- If bread gets jammed, unplug the toaster, let it cool, and carefully remove the bread.
- Don't use the appliance for any purpose other than those described in these instructions.
- Route the cable so it doesn't overhang, and can't be tripped over or caught.
- Don't cover the appliance or put anything on top of it.
- Don't operate the appliance if it's damaged or malfunctions.

HOUSEHOLD USE ONLY

BEFORE USING FOR THE FIRST TIME

- 1. Set the browning level to maximum (7).
- 2. Operate the appliance empty, to cure the new elements.
- 3. This may smell a bit, but it's nothing to worry about. Ensure the room is well ventilated.

TOASTING BREAD

- 1. Sit the toaster upright on a firm, level, heat-resistant surface.
- 2. Put the plug into the power socket.
- 3. Turn the browning control to the required setting (1 = light, 7 = dark).

- 4. Put bread into the toasting slots (maximum thickness 27mm).
- 5. Press the lever down fully. It won't lock down unless the toaster is connected to the electricity supply.
- 6. The elements will heat up.
- 7. When it's done, the toast will pop up.
- 8. To stop toasting, press **≜**.

FROZEN BREAD

- 1. Leave the browning level at your favoured setting, insert the frozen bread, lower the lever, then press 🕸.

REHEATING TOAST

- 1. Leave the browning control at your favoured setting, insert the bread, lower the lever, then press 🖱.
- 2. The 📇 light will come on, and the toast will be given a short burst of heat.
- 3. Don't reheat "buttered", torn, or misshapen bread.

HINTS AND TIPS

- Old (yesterday's) bread has less moisture, so makes crisper toast.
- Old bread, thin slices, and sweet bread products (tea cakes, fruit loaf, etc.) will brown faster so use a lower setting.

CARE AND MAINTENANCE

- Unplug the toaster and let it cool down.
- Wipe outer surfaces with a damp cloth.

ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION

To avoid environmental and health problems due to hazardous substances in electrical and electronic goods, appliances marked with this symbol mustn't be disposed of with unsorted municipal waste, but recovered, reused, or recycled.
